People with serious mental illnesses die – on average – 25 years earlier than the general population, according to a study by the National Association of State Mental Health Program Directors (NASMHPD). Treatable medical conditions that are caused by modifiable risk factors – including smoking – are among the main reasons for this discrepancy. Many hospitals and other treatment settings have been looking for ways to reduce the health impact of smoking in their facilities. Many jurisdictions are now requiring smoke-free environments. However, designing and implementing smoke-free policies in psychiatric settings raises many clinical and administrative questions.

To help hospitals and other treatment settings set smoking cessation policies, the National Association of Psychiatric Health Systems has organized a special telephone conference call. The two-hour training will explore both policy and clinical considerations of concern to facilities' clinical and administrative leadership. The faculty includes representatives of treatment facilities that have moved to smoke-free environments as well as national experts working with the Smoking Cessation Leadership Center at the University of California, San Francisco, to address the specific challenges facing psychiatric patients.

The telephone conference format allows you to get all the benefits of an interactive conference – without ever leaving your office – and without breaking your budget.
